We are looking for individuals that need better housing, are able to pay an affordable mortgage, and willing to partner with Habitat to build their home and their neighbor's.



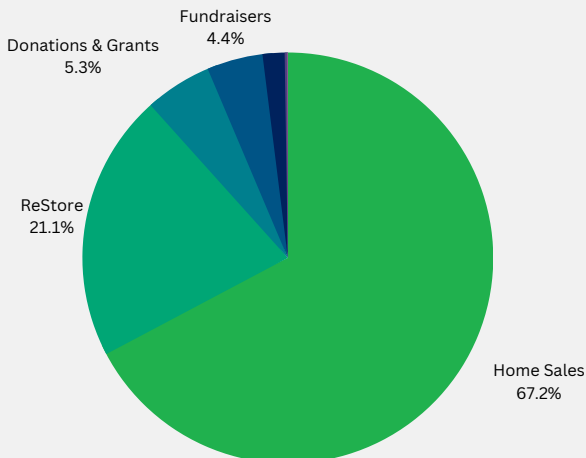
The application period opens on April 5 and closes May 13 at 5 pm.

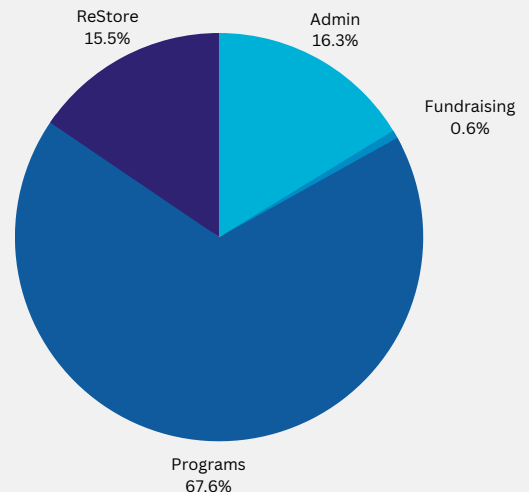

SINCE 1989, WE'VE BUILT 64 HOMES, REPRESENTING 71 FAMILIES, 101 ADULTS, AND 151 CHILDREN.

"Homeownership means everything to us. It means being able to provide my children a safe and loving place to call home. It gives them the stability and security that they haven't had, but that I have dreamed of giving them. On a single income, it is difficult to find an affordable home.

I want to show my kids that hard work and honesty can pay off. This home means we have a place where we can start rebuilding our lives. We can create new, good memories, and have a safe place to play and grow. This means getting our lives back, having a future, and having something to look forward to."
